



# MA - Master at Arms

Masters at Arms are security specialists who perform antiterrorism, force protection, physical security, and law enforcement duties on land and at sea. They may operate a force protection watercraft, direct an investigation, control a base access point, or supervise a K9 asset. Due to the unique functions of the MA, strict adherence to eligibility criteria must be maintained.

## WHAT THEY DO

- Conduct waterborne security patrol and interdiction operations;
- Conduct U. S. Customs inspections;
- Conduct base security patrols;
- Conduct base access and entry control operations;
- Implement aircraft and flightline security standards;
- Conduct law enforcement operations;
- Provide Oil Platform protection;
- Conduct river security operations;
- Provide protective service to high ranking dignitaries and government officials;
- Supervise K-9 explosive and narcotics detection operations/missions;
- Perform physical security inspections;
- Conduct preliminary investigations into UCMJ violations;
- Organize and train security force personnel;
- Conduct crime prevention programs;
- Operate brigs (jails);
- Perform weapons and funds escorts.



## CAREER PATH AFTER RECRUIT TRAINING

Enlistees are taught the fundamentals of this rating through on-the-job training or formal Navy schooling. Advanced technical and operational training is available in this rating during later stages of career development.

After completion of "A" School, MAs may be assigned to ships or shore facilities in the United States or overseas. During a 20-year period in the Navy, MAs spend about 60 percent of their time assigned to fleet units and 40 percent to overseas and shore stations.

## WORKING ENVIRONMENT



MAs may expect to be assigned to duty at shore stations in the United States and overseas; aboard ships as either ship's company or embarked security team; or as part of a maritime expeditionary security squadron. The work environment varies widely with individual assignments. MAs are currently serving in expeditionary security locations worldwide and providing landward and seaward security in support of Joint Service operations.

## OPPORTUNITIES



Opportunities for placement are excellent for qualified personnel. Individual motivation, ability, and work ethic will determine how far an MA can advance in the enlisted or officer ranks during a 20- to 30-year career. An MA who has attained the rank of E-6 may be eligible to apply for the Limited Duty Officer (LDO) Program. An MA who has achieved the rank of E-7 may be eligible to apply for the Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) Program. Both of these programs enable an MA to become a Security Specialist in the officer ranks.

## QUALIFICATIONS & INTERESTS



Those personnel who want to qualify for the MA rating should be people oriented, dedicated, resourceful, and versatile. They should possess strong writing and speaking skills, a good memory, and the ability to conduct detailed work while maintaining accurate records. Prospective MAs should possess physical strength, manual dexterity, and competence with tools, equipment and machines.

### EARN DEPARTMENT OF LABOR (DOL) NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED APPRENTICESHIPS

### EARN INDUSTRY RECOGNIZED CREDENTIALS

Navy COOL catalogs and defines comprehensive information on occupational credentials - including certifications, licenses, and apprenticeships - correlating with every Navy rating and some collateral duties. It provides "how to" instructions for pursuing these credentials, links to credentialing organizations, and cross-references to programs that help Sailors pay for credentialing fees. Shortly following the initial rating technical training (Class "A" technical school), Sailors may be able to take advantage of earning civilian/industry certifications & licenses (credentials), funded through Navy COOL.
